The Taylors seem to touch every corner of their community with their positivity and professionalism. They have received numerous honors for their work including a Friends of Education Award and a Congressional Recognition from their local Congressman Joe Courtney.

"We believe in giving back to our community and we just do it. We don't think it's anything special, it's just how we do things," says Robyn.

The Taylors were so surprised to learn they were being nominated for TravelCenters' Citizen Driver award that, when Landstar called to inform them of their nominations, they responded "What for?" As the process continued, and the Taylors became finalists, they again responded in disbelief.
